#### RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

### Rationale

The Human Resources Development Council Top Occupations in Demand (HRDC 2016) has identified the transport and logistics sector as a priority area for skills development based on the sub-sectors growth and potential for creation of employment.

Further, the National Development Plan (NPD11) asserts the need for qualified personnel in logistics and supply chain management. The Plan states that the country would undertake reforms to facilitate the movement of goods and services, for efficiency and effectiveness, through the simplification and streamlining of import and export procedures, as well as the modernization of border procedures and control techniques.

The Botswana's Vision 2036 (2015:15-19) explains that transport and logistics sector in Botswana are playing a central role in bankrolling the economic activities through their supporting of the movement of goods and services. In acknowledgement of these positive contributions, the Botswana Government has set among its priorities the development of the transport sector by driving infrastructural development. The Vision 2036 (2015:17) further explains that Transport and logistics services are essential for the economy to support the movement of persons, goods and services.

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The Botswana Transport & Infrastructure Statistics Report (2015) also postulates that the transport sector in Botswana has played an important role in economic growth in the 50 years post-independence. This assertion is justified by statistics to the effect that the Transport sector's contribution to the Country's GDP has been on the rise since 2006 (2.6%), to 5.6% in 2015.

### **Purpose**

The proposed Diploma In Transport Management and Logistics is aimed at incubating professionals with well-rounded managerial, professional and industry specific intellectual competencies, knowledge and skills to be able to identify, analyse, evaluate, critically reflect on and solve complex problems within the Transport Management field. They should be able to make managerial decisions in the context of Transport and analyse, synthesize and evaluate information; communicate these decisions, ideas and/or opinions using appropriate academic, professional or occupational standards.

# **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (including access and inclusion)**

 Applicants must have obtained a minimum qualification of NCQF Level IV, Certificate IV (e.g. BGCSE), with four credits at or its equivalent including a pass in English language.

ii. Candidates must have successfully completed a level 5 Certificate in Transport Management and Logistics, or its equivalent from a recognized institution.

iii. Special Entry: Candidates who do not have the minimum academic qualifications stated above but have five years relevant work experience in a related field, will be considered upon satisfying the requirements of the Academic Affairs Board that might include an entrance interview.

# **MODERATION ARRANGEMENTS**

#### **Assessment**

All assessments which are leading to the award of the qualification should be based on learning outcomes and associated assessment criteria.

### i. Formative assessment

The weightings for the Formative Assessment component which contributes to the awarding of credits is to be weighted as follows:

- 2 Assignments 13%
- Test -14%
- Mid-Term Mock Examinations 13%

The weighting of formative assessment is 40 % of the Final assessment mark.

### ii. Summative assessment

Final examinations

The weighting of summative assessment is 60 % of the Final assessment mark

### Internal moderation requirements

i. All assessment instruments should be internally moderated before administration

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- ii. All marked scripts should be moderated internally
- iii. The preparation of the moderation should be accompanied by the Assessment Matrix.
- iv. Reports and associated documents to be in place for external moderation should include but not limited to:

### **External moderation requirements**

External moderation is a final check, by external subject experts, that the examination and marking is at the right standard for the type and level of the qualification. External moderation exercise may lead to a decision to change marks. Each sub-field will have a Substantive External Examiner.

### RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (if applicable)

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is a form of assessment for eligibility into the qualification. It allows recognition of skills and knowledge acquired through informal learning such as work or life experience. RPL is granted where the candidate is able to provide sufficient evidence of their competence in a module as determined by the appointed RPL Assessor.

Candidates wishing to apply for RPL assessment submit their applications three months prior to the commencement of the qualification they seek to enroll in. All prospective students will complete an application form and attach all required evidence, in the form of following:

- In-house training certificates
- Examples of work produced
- Workplace reference
- Statement of duties
- Project Work
- Newspaper cuttings of achievements
- Minutes of meetings attended or conducted
- Documents showing organizing/supervisory skills

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Awards, commendations, certificates of merit

All evidence presented shall be reviewed and will match that evidence against the Performance Criteria stated in the Unit of Competency. It may be necessary to ask questions about the evidence or ask the candidate to perform an activity or undergo a test to provide evidence where there are gaps between what has been provided and what is required.

### QUALIFICATION AWARD AND CERTIFICATION

i. Candidates meeting the prescribed requirements will be awarded the qualification in accordance with the qualification composition rules and applicable policies. To be eligible for the award, candidates must have successfully completed all core and elective modules and passed examinations in accordance with regulations set by the Faculty. The Diploma in Transport Management and Logistics will be awarded to candidates who have obtained a minimum of 252credits.

#### REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

This qualification has been benchmarked with the following local, regional and international institutions:

- 1. Gaborone University College of Law and Professional Studies Diploma In Transport Planning and Management
- 2. University Of Johannesburg (South Africa) Diploma In Transportation Management
- 3. Dublin Institute of Technology (DIT) Dublin UK Diploma in Logistics and Supply Chain Management)

### **COMPARABILITY:**

**Similarities:** All the Diploma qualifications have a component of Transport management/planning. The Diplomas are all offered a period of two years except for the UJ Diploma which is offered over three years. All the benchmarked institutions have an industrial learning (attachment) component.

**Differences:** University of Johannesburg Diploma do not offer the logistics component in their curriculum. Dublin Institute of Technology (DIT) does not offer the Transport Management component in their Diploma. University of Johannesburg offer their Diploma over a period of 36 months whereas Dublin Institute of Technology (DIT) offers its Diploma over 12 months.

**Assessment:** Assignments, tests, and Examination are used by all benchmarked institutions to assess the learners. There are however some differences in the assessment component contribution to the final learner results.

**Certification:** Certification for the Diploma is only on successful completion of the set credits for all the institutions.

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# Summary:

In purview of the above, the proposed Diploma in Transport Management and Logistics has a cut above all the noted competitors in that it brings out a well-balanced learner in the areas of Transport, Logistics and Supply Chain Management which individually done of the benchmarked Diplomas is doing.
