Formative assessment:

Formative assessments will constitute 40% of the final mark.

MODERATION:

Both internal and external moderation will be done in-line with the Moderation policy of the Institution. In addition, all Moderators and Assessors must be registered and accredited with Botswana Qualification Authority (BQA).

Diagonal articulation:

The graduates may study certificate V in Copyright Law in the Entertainment Industry (NCQF level 6) or Project Management Principles and Tools in the Entertainment Industry (NCQF level 6) at any local, regional or International Tertiary institution and may be exempted for some modules which are common to both qualifications based on syllabus content.

After finishing the qualification students shall be able to fit in the industry as:

- Entrepreneurs
- Camera assistants within the film industry
- Technical assistants within in Grips and Lighting
- Technical assistants in the multi cam television studio
- Assistants in Rigging for Stage, Studio and Live Performance
- Assistants in Production Co-ordination
- Wardrobe, make-up, and styling assistants
- Assistants in stage management within the live performance industry

QUALIFICATION AWARD AND CERTIFICATION

Qualification Award

The candidate must achieve 120 credits to be awarded with Certificate V in Film Production. Candidate must do all the fundamental component of 40 credits and core modules of 80 credits, to make total of 120 credit and to be awarded with Certificate V in Film Production.

Candidates meeting prescribed requirements will be awarded the qualification in accordance with standards prescribed for the award of the qualification and applicable policies.
