## RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

### **RATIONALE:**

This qualification is in line with the Botswana Vision 2036 precisely pillar number 4, which provides that, "A crime-free environment is a prerequisite for peace and stability. Socio-economic development, freedom from fear and violence, safe neighborhoods and an efficient justice system should be the norm. A peaceful and politically stable country is an attractive destination for investment."

Through the Botswana Police College Training Needs Assessment (TNA) (2017:43) paragraph 4.8 (a) amongst some of the challenges faced by members of the Botswana Police Service in executing their daily duties was handling and investigating emerging crimes like Cybercrime, Drug trafficking and Terrorism. It was also established that they generally lack appropriate leadership skills which subsequently leads to unnecessary acquittal of cases.

#### PURPOSE:

The Command, Leadership and Tactics Qualification is intended to equip learners with supervision, leadership and command skills. The skills include control, tactical decision making as well as Public Order Management. The qualification is meant for organizational middle management officers as it will equip them with the necessary skills, knowledge and attitude on field craft, tactics and leadership skills. It has been tailor made to help officers to deal with tasks, goals and objectives that need to be accomplished more effectively by working as a team.

The purpose of this qualification is to produce learners who are competent, adaptable, innovative, creative in command, as well as physically and mentally fit for purpose.

Upon completion of this qualification candidates would have been capacitated to be able to:

- Appreciate the importance of physical and mental fitness
- Perform police duties for prolonged hours
- Demonstrate ability and willingness to work under harsh weather conditions.
- Demonstrate knowledge on weapons and their ammunition
- Demonstrate relevant tactics in dispersing rioters in a lawful manner

Main Exit Outcomes, Domains or Modules, Assessment strategies and Weightings, Qualification rules and minimum Standards for the award of the qualification, Education and Employment Pathways are not provided.

#### South Africa

TSU Training Solutions in South Africa also offers Crowd Management Course in a period of seven days and NCQF Level, Credits, Main Exit Outcomes, Domains or Modules, Assessment strategies and Weightings, Qualification rules and minimum Standards for the award of the qualification, Education and Employment Pathways are not indicated within the qualification as compared to the proposed qualification.

### **United Kingdom**
