#### RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

Botswana has moved from being a low income to a middle income nation. This therefore, calls for a solid collaboration amongst the scholarly world (in terms of advanced research works) and the industries for the country to reach sustainable development. Advanced level of research to guide policy for this kind of development is therefore a priority. The Doctor of Philosophy in Economics was developed with the aim of producing graduates who can conduct and promote most advanced level research on some social sciences related topics. The qualification is therefore demand driven in the sense that the government, think tanks, academia and international organisations (e.g. World Bank IMF etc) have huge desire for graduates trained in economic research who could fulfil some of the mandates of these institutions and to guide economic policy for development.

The qualification is particularly relevant in the implementation of the Botswana Vision 2036 and the National Human Resource Development Strategy (2009-2022) which provides a strategic framework to guide Botswana towards becoming a knowledge-based society. To fulfil the mandates of these frameworks, the

qualification aims to produce competent Economists who can contribute to development using evidence-based interventions. The qualification is consistent with the Human Resource Development Council (HRDC) of Botswana document on priority skills and employment trends that identified key policy analysts and economic researchers as priority areas. To fulfil the mandate of the HRDC document, the qualification seeks to produce graduates who are competent in both research and policy advisory.

## **PURPOSE:**

Graduates of this qualification should be able to:

- 1. Conduct advanced economics research.
- 2. Plan, direct and coordinate research activities in both private and public enterprises.
- 3. Provide policy advice on economic issues.
- 4. Provide academic leadership on how the social world works and evaluate causes and interventions.
- 5. Teach and supervise research at the highest institutions, such as universities

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (including access and inclusion)

The minimum requirement for admission shall be:

A Masters degree (NCQF Level 9).

### Qualification award

To be awarded a Doctor of Philosophy in Economics degree, a candidate must acquire a minimum of 360 credits as shown in the qualification structure and rules of combination.

#### Certification

Candidates meeting prescribed requirements will be awarded a Doctor of Philosophy in Economics qualification in accordance with standards prescribed for the award of the qualification and applicable policies. A candidate shall be issued with a Certificate and Academic Transcript.

Candidates that do not meet the prescribed minimum standard will be awarded a transcript.

### REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

This qualification was compared to the qualification of the following Universities: University of Pretoria (PhD in Economics), Stellenbosch University (PhD in Economics), both in South Africa and Oxford University (DPhil in Economics) in the UK.

The structure of this qualification and regional and international qualifications is largely similar

- The qualifications offer the degree purely by research.
- The main exit outcomes (high quality research) and employment pathways (positions in the academia, employment in government institutions, private sector) are mainly similar.

There are no major differences between this Doctor of Philosophy in Economics qualification and comparable qualifications internationally and regionally

- It may be observed that qualifications frameworks are not exactly similar.
- University of Pretoria and Oxford University encourage students to first enrol for MPhil in Economics before they enrol for a Doctor of Philosophy degree.

### **REVIEW PERIOD**

The qualification will be reviewed in five (5) years in line with the NCQF.
