RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

RATIONALE:

The rationale of the qualification is to provide qualifiers with knowledge, specific skills, applied competences and the necessary attitudes in specialised areas in the field of law. The qualifier will contribute at an advanced level to the development of knowledge in law. The qualifiers will be prepared for advanced specialized employment in law.

The Human Resource Development Council in Botswana (HRDC) has identified certain areas where there is shortage of skills in the country (HRDC, 2012). Some of the skills identified are in the social sciences such as lawyers. The Ministry of Education under the Tertiary Education Policy entitled "Towards a Knowledge Economy" also underscores the importance of developing "a holistic approach to developing the nation's human resource capacity" (Ministry of Education, Tertiary education Policy, 2008: 6). The World Bank (nd) policy note on "Botswana labour market signals on demand for skills" has also identified need for managers and supervisors in certain skills categories. The Botswana Vision 2036 further recognises education and skills development as the basis for human resource development. The Master of Laws qualification is designed to meet this market gap with specialised and advanced legal skills.

- Train graduates with sound theoretical, conceptual and methodological grounding in specialist areas of law
- Develop competence in critical thinking, intellectual autonomy and originality in identifying investigating and resolving a research problem
- Enable qualifiers to retrieve, evaluate, analyse, interpret ad synthesise date to make informed decisions
- Prepare qualifiers to conduct self-directed study with scholarly and professional integrity
- Prepare learners with competence in applying knowledge through high level research
- Produce graduates with knowledge and skills to solve complex problems independently systematically and creatively
- Train graduates who can operate in familiar and unfamiliar contexts
- Develop effective communicators who can disseminate findings to specialists and non-specialist groups
- Develop ability to identify new areas of research within a specialized disciplinary, professional or occupational context and to lead others in appropriate investigation
- Prepare graduates for specialised employment with high level of personal responsibility and accountability and ability to supervise groups or teams
- Enable qualifiers to articulate into specialised in various fields of law through obtaining higher qualifications and professional accreditations.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (including access and inclusion)

Minimum Entry Requirements

The minimum admission requirement is a Bachelor's Degree Honours (NCQF Level 8) in Law.

RPL and CATS

Applicants who do not meet the above criterion but possess relevant industry experience may be considered using RPL and CATS policies for access.

LLM by coursework and research essay:

The qualification has no credits allocated to the fundamental component. The Core component, which is the research essay contributes **80** credits, which meets the minimum number of credits allocated to research for a master's degree under the national qualifications framework. The elective component contributes **160** credits, for a total of **240** credits.

OR

LLM by coursework and dissertation:

The qualification has no credits allocated to the fundamental component. The Core component, which is the research essay contributes **160** credits, which includes the minimum number of 80 credits allocated to research for a master's degree under the national qualifications framework. The elective component contributes **80** credits, for a total of **240** credits.

OR

LLM by dissertation only:

The qualification has no credits allocated to the fundamental component. The qualification has no elective component. The Core component, which is the research essay contributes **240** credits, which includes the minimum number of 80 credits allocated to research for a master's degree under the national qualification's framework.

ASSESSMENT ARRANGEMENTS

Assessment of course work will be comprised of 50% formative assessment (assignments and term papers) and 50% summative assessment (examinations). Assessment of research will be through an internal and external assessor report of the learner's research output.

MODERATION ARRANGEMENTS

There will be internal and external moderation as a quality assurance measure in line with the ETP policy. Moderators must be suitably qualified in the field of law.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

Recognition of prior learning will be applicable for the award of the Master of Laws degree on a case-by-case basis and as per the regulations and policies of the ETP, and in alignment with national policy.

CREDIT ACCUMULATION AND TRANSFER

Credit accumulation and transfer will be applicable for award of this qualification on a case-by-case assessment and as per the regulations of the ETP and in line with international policies.

QUALIFICATION AWARD AND CERTIFICATION

Qualification

To be awarded the degree of Master of Laws the candidate must have a minimum of 240 credits.

Certification

On successful completion of studies, the student will be awarded the Master of Laws degree certificate.

REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

The LLM qualification is generally comparable in terms of qualification in credits, course content, exit level outcomes, and assessment criteria with the regional and international qualifications considered in South Africa, Ireland and the United Kingdom.

The structure of the Botswana qualification and regional and international qualifications is largely similar

- All qualifications combine coursework with research or allow research only masters
- All qualifications allow flexibility in choice of courses at maters level

There are no major differences between the Botswana LLM qualification and comparable qualifications internationally and regionally

- It may be observed that qualifications frameworks are not exactly similar.

- The Botswana qualification does not offer any core courses.
