RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION																

#### **RATIONALE:**

The Labour Market Analysis Study by HRDC (2016) on top occupations in high demand noted Creative Industries Sector as one of the sub-field occupations of high priority (Occupation Code No. 2651). It is one of the many occupations "...that have been identified by the employers as being in high demand at national level" In view of this, consultations were carried out by a professional panel of experts who developed an Occupational Profile of a Visual Artist (July 2017) through DACUM process to close gaps from concerns that have been raised by HRDC regarding the mismatch of skills in the labour market. Among the profiled areas is conducting research to produce artworks, marketing of artworks, restoring artworks and maintaining a Health and Safety Environment.

This qualification was developed in line with the national documents: 1) Botswana Vision 2036 which acknowledges that the "Creative Industries is an upcoming sector that processes great potential to create employment, diversify the economy and earn foreign investment". The Vision further emphasizes implementation of curriculum which is aligned to the needs of the economy and business, science, mathematics and technology in which the Botswana society will be knowledgeable with relevant quality education that is outcomes-based (education with production) The Draft TVET Policy Mission; to "provide the national economy with employable skilled workforce to meet the



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labour market needs of the nation ...leading to economic diversification" (pg. 4). All this is what this qualification stands out for as far as the needs of the society are concerned.

In terms of practice and investment growth, this industry has played a significant role in creating an enabling environment for development of individual skills. Entities such as Thapong Visual Arts, Botswana Crafts and Museums and Art Galleries offer Batswana creative artists the opportunity to get support from tourists as they showcase their talents and skills through their artistic products.

- Perform duties and tasks pertaining to creativity and innovativeness
- Demonstrate the ability to market artworks and manage projects
- Apply creative and advanced technical knowledge and skills

- Restore artworks.
- Conduct and supervise studio processes.
- Conduct basic research processes.

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

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- The Core and Fundamental component at level 5 consists of modules to the value of 68 credits all of which

- The Elective component at level 6 consists of 2 modules to the value of **16** credits acquired as the candidate chooses 2 units among the 6 units available.

#### FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT

#### SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT

Assessment includes written and practical examinations or projects. The final assessment for each module (unit) contributes **40%** of the final mark for that module.

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## Certification

A **Diploma in Visual Arts** will be awarded to a Candidate upon completion of the qualification in accordance with applicable policies. A certificate and transcript will be issued at award.

#### REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

It is of vital importance that the qualification compares with or relates to similar qualifications or best practices, or standards offered regionally and other parts of the world. This involves the qualification benchmarking against comparable qualifications in the same field in the region and internationally. The comparison therefore becomes a yard stick to the qualification developed and may offer opportunity for possible collaboration, exchange programmes, students' excursions as well as enrolment for further education.
