## RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

# RATIONALE:

The dynamics of Botswana's political and cultural landscape has changed drastically since independence. The historical heritage of the country needs to be attended to. The ethnic and cultural diversity of the country also need close attention, as well as the changing economic and political dynamics. All these changes necessitate skills in policy analysis, political commentary, and historical analysis to preserve the historical heritage of Botswana, ie. cultural and historical heritage sites. The MA qualification should equip people with the skills mentioned above. The Human Resource Development Council (HRDC) has identified gaps for historians, political analysts, and philosophers.

The MA history qualification will meet market needs in Botswana and internationally wherever professionals with skills in historical problem solving, research and innovation are in demand. The qualification shall equip graduates with advanced research and analytical skills, independent thinking and innovative approaches to problem solving. The MA in History is in line with the transformation of Botswana's economy from a resource-



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based to a knowledge- and skills-based one, as pronounced in the National Human Resources Development Strategy (2009 - 2022). The qualification is also informed by the Botswana National Cultural Policy (2001) which, together with Vision 2036 emphasises Botswana's multicultural and multilingual orientation with diversity, unity and development as key pillars.

### **Needs of the Botswana Job Market**

First and foremost, Botswana needs History graduates as teachers, who will have a full education in the subject and thus able to provide a high-quality education in schools. Many History graduates, however, will be employed not in the specific field of History, but in areas where the skills of analysis of real-world complex situations are of value. Graduates who majored in History have populated every niche in the private and public sector, as teachers, senior civil service administrators, diplomats, journalists, officers in the police and army, businessmen and women, secondary and tertiary educational administrators, consultants, politicians, publishers, and media producers.

## **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this qualification is to produce graduates with advanced knowledge, skills, and competences to:

- Analyse data from primary and secondary sources such as contemporary records of past events.
- Conduct research in fields such as political philosophy or past and present theory and practice of political systems, institutions, or behaviour.
- Provide political commentary and expert knowledge as and when necessary.
- Develop political and cultural policies, and provide guidance based on lessons of History.
- Preserve historical and cultural heritage by maintaining accurate knowledge of cultural and historical events.

# **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (including access and inclusion)**

- Bachelor's degree, NCQF level 7
- Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and Credit Accumulation and Transfer (CAT) will be applicable for access and inclusion.

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## Similarities:

No credit shown. University of York and University of Cape Town offer a similar Masters of Arts Degree in History with emphasis on historiography, historical research methodology and various modules on national and international issues. Thus, all the qualifications emphasise research and historical methodology courses as core components. The three qualifications offer both core and optional courses. Qualifications of both University of York and University of Cape Town emphasise transferable skills, such as carrying out independent research in primary sources, analytic thinking and communication skills, which are also embedded in this qualification through modules, such as discourse analysis, public policy and research. The compared qualifications also offer employment pathways or careers in fields of Research Management and as Historians.

## Differences:

While this qualification and that of the University of Cape Town offer a two-year Master's degree, the University of York offer a one-year Master Degree qualification. The University of Cape Town offers two separate Masters degree in history qualification (Coursework Master's in Historical Studies and Research Master's in Historical Studies). Furthermore, the title for the University of Cape Town qualification slightly differs as it is a Master in Historical Studies.
