### RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

### RATIONALE:

Societies cannot avoid the influence of religious ideas, practices, images, language, and values in our everyday life, work, and play. Theology and Religion are important in human development because they provide firm point of reference at work, family and community interactions. The Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Theology and Religious Studies is consistent with the national (Vision 2036; RNPE 1994; National Curriculum Assessment Framework, 2015; national Human Rights Strategy 2015-2016) and international policies (African Union Agenda 2063). In particular, Aspirations 3 of the Agenda 2063 talks to the significance of respect for



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human rights, justice and the rule of law while Aspiration 4 of the same agenda 2063 calls for a peaceful and secure Africa. Without mutual respect across religions the world will continue to face issues of religious intolerance (for instance, the September 11 2001 event). Therefore a student that graduates from the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Theology and Religious Studies qualification must display the following human qualities: mutual respect, respect of difference, tolerances and empathy. While religious traditions constantly change, and new socio-economic political and cultural challenges arise in every age, and the past century or so present a particular challenge to contemporary cultures and societies. They present particular challenges to the social order – both religious and secular - that can lead to social tension and conflict.

The qualification is also relevant to NDP 11 on man-power development, SADCC's protocol on Education and Training as well as UNESCO's education (2030). The latter is aligned to the Incheon Declaration and Framework for Action to promote the implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 4-"to ensure an inclusive and equitable education and promote life-long learning opportunities for all" (Education 2030). The Doctor of Philosophy in Theology and Religious will contribute to the development of skills and competences for quality education.

### **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this qualification is to produce graduates who have advanced knowledge, analytical skills and competences to:

- Conduct high quality academic research for the expansion of knowledge in Theology, Philosophy Biblical and Religious Studies.
- Develop teaching and learning programmes relevant to theological, religious, biblical and philosophical contexts.
- Evaluate social, environmental and ethical concerns associated with the theological, religious, biblical and philosophical areas.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (including access and inclusion)

Entry Requirements for Doctor of Philosophy in Theology and Religious Studies are as follows:

- NCQF Level 9 (Master of Arts in Theology) or equivalent qualification.
- Entry through recognition of prior learning in line with institutional and National policies.

The normal duration of this qualification shall be in accordance with General Regulations Specific for Doctor of Philosophy qualifications

- A minimum of 3 to a maximum of 6 years on a full-time basis
- A minimum of 4 to a maximum of 8 years part-time basis

The normal workload for Doctor of Philosophy in Theology and Religious Education shall be 360 credits

- Proposal- 180 credits
- Thesis- 180 credits
- Total: 360 credits



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The qualification shall consist of a supervised research proposal and a supervised dissertation around which candidates will explore areas of interest relevant to specialization in any of the four areas of Theology, Religious Studies, Biblical Studies or Philosophy.

### ASSESSMENT ARRANGEMENTS

### Assessment will be Formative.

- Formative assessment will include a defence of a research proposal.
- There is no percentage evaluation towards the final mark. The proposal either fails or passes.
- Summative assessment will constitute the final thesis and the oral defence of the thesis: 100%
- Assessment shall be carried out by both internal and external assessors.

### **MODERATION ARRANGEMENTS**

- The qualification shall have two types of moderation, namely Internal Moderation and External Moderation, in accordance with applicable institutional and national policies and regulations.
- Assessors and moderators shall be registered and accredited by BQA.

### RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and Credit Accumulation Transfer (CAT) will be applicable for consideration for award in this qualification and will be in line with the Institutional and National policies.
