RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

RATIONALE

Most organizations recognize the importance of security management skills. The growth of the needs for security links to the types of threats that prevail in a society. These include threats to personal safety, personal property, organizational assets, and communal interests. Hence, most organizations are forced to recruit professionals in security management to safeguard their properties, personnel as well as assets.

Security management skills are essential to run the day-to-day activities within an organization without disruption; to deal with high tech crimes and sophisticated criminal behaviors (Hollin, C.R., 2013). Professionals from this field of study should possess the necessary skills in modern security management, techniques and technology in order to administer, supervise or manage security issues in a workplace effectively. The rapid changes urge the industry to apply new approaches in security management, which in turn demand appropriate training on a wide range of issues such as managing risks; securing institutional assets and buildings; information and data protection (Ortmeier, P.J., 2001). Therefore, the proposed qualification will help learners to have a wide range of skills, knowledge and competences that enable them to effectively in different government, corporate and private security agencies.

The Diploma in Security Management qualification is aligned to national policies such as Vision 2036 and National Development Plan (NDP 11). As stated in Vision 2036, Botswana will be a land of peace and a crime free environment. Peace and security are the main issue for any country including Botswana to bring a change in the socio-economic development. Thus, this qualification will help to produce skilled and competent security officers who can play an important role in the reduction of crime, fears & violence

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(Vision 2030 Presidential Task Team, 2016). Moreover, NDP 11 emphasizes on security, safety and good governance which are the preconditions to provide a conducive environment for domestic and foreign investors (Minister of Finance & Economic Development, 2017). Investors will invest in the country where there is little risk of loss of property and personal safety. Security management, therefore, is an important qualification in order to fulfil the goal of NDP 11 as it plays significant role in providing personal protection, safeguarding private and public organizations.

Furthermore, the findings from stakeholders' survey revealed the fact that this qualification is most needed as the country is still facing shortage of human resources related to Security Management.

Purpose

The purpose of this qualification is to equip learners so that they will be able to:

- Apply security management concepts and principles in crime prevention, safety, and loss prevention.
- Develop risk management plans to mitigate security issues.
- Analyze the current issues that security industry faces.
- Analyze the role of psychology in investigation of crime.
- Demonstrate the ability to use security technologies.
- Demonstrate understanding of major aspects of physical security and associated threats.

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Rules of combinations, Credit distribution (where applicable):

Rule of combination

The credit distribution for level 5, level 6 and level 7 and elective of the qualification diploma in Security Management.

Learners are required to select any four (4) modules from the elective component which has got 15 credits. Learners are required to successfully complete the qualification with designated minimum number of credits, i.e., 360 credits.

MODERATION ARRANGEMENTS

ASSESSMENT

Formative or Continuous assessments (CA)

 The outcomes of each module in the qualification are assessed through formative (continuous) assessment. It will contribute 60% to the final grade.

Summative assessments

This will contribute 40% to the final grade.

Assessment will be administered by assessors registered and accredited by BQA or any other recognized authority.

MODERATION

Both internal and external moderation will be carried out by moderators registered and accredited by BQA or any other recognized authority.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (if applicable)

There will be provision for awarding qualification through RPL in accordance with ETP and National policy on RPL.

QUALIFICATION AWARD AND CERTIFICATION

Upon successful completion (pass) of the required course work and industrial attachment the candidate will be awarded a Diploma in Security Management. For learners to be awarded the qualification, they need to complete a total credit of 360 with the required fundamental, core and elective modules.

Candidates who qualify to be awarded the qualification will be issued a Diploma in Security Management Certificate.

REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

• The proposed qualification and the Diploma in Security Management qualification at UNISA, SA, have similarity in terms of classification, that is, both are diploma at level 6. In addition, both qualifications



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have similar main exit learning outcomes, assessment strategies and education & employment pathways. The proposed qualification; however, is different from the qualification at UNISA in terms of duration, credit value, and total number of modules.

• The proposed qualification is similar with the Diploma in Security Management qualification at President College, Malaysia, in terms classification as all are 'Diploma in Security Management' at level 6. In addition, both qualifications have similar main exit learning outcomes, education & employment pathways. Furthermore, most modules offered by President College are similar with the modules of the proposed qualification. The proposed qualification; however, is different from the qualification at President College in terms of total number of modules.

REVIEW PERIOD

This qualification shall be reviewed every five years.
