RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

RATIONALE:

The rationale for this qualification in Chinese Studies is supported by public policy documents such as Vision 2036, which underline the importance of connecting Botswana to the global world and to international expertise and know-how in order to build a competitive knowledge-based economy (Vision 2036, p. 14). In line with this view, the tertiary sector is called upon to produce competitive graduates with international exposure who are able to participate in and contribute to the globally connected economy (National Human Resources Development Strategy (2009-2022), p. 36 and Vision 2036, p. 13). The qualification proposed herewith enables learners to plug into one of the most dynamic regions in the world today, namely China and by extension the whole of East Asia. Since the turn of the millennium, China's significance in world affairs has grown dramatically. For example, Botswana-China trade grew from BWP 34 million in 2000 to BWP 2.1 billion in 2012 (Sekakela 2016). To Botswana and the whole of Africa, China nowadays is a major source of aid, finance, investment, tourism etc. and a key partner in tackling challenges such as climate change, economic

development, education, environmental conservation, industrialization, public health and even peace and security (Oqubai & Lin 2019, Sun 2017, Taylor 2009). To successfully negotiate and navigate this fast growing partnership, Botswana needs its own expertise on China (Youngman 2016). This qualification therefore aims to produce graduates with Mandarin Chinese language skills, intercultural skills and understanding of China.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this qualification is to produce graduates with specialised knowledge, skills, and competences to:

- Interact competently with the culture, economy and society of China using advanced Mandarin Chinese language skills and specialized intercultural knowledge and skills.
- Make well-informed and skilled contributions to the development of relations with China by public and private sector actors in the local, regional and global arena.
- Apply analytical and critical thinking in approaching topics related to Botswana's and Africa's growing relations with the world's foremost emerging power

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (including access and inclusion)

Candidates who wish to obtain this qualification must be in possession of a qualification at a minimum of NCQF Level 4 or its equivalents.

Provision for Recognition of Prior Learning will be made guided by institutional policies and national policies.

REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

The proposed qualification combines multidisciplinary study of different aspects of China with extensive training in Mandarin Chinese language. The benchmarking exercise revealed many reputable Universities internationally that offer comparable qualifications. Regionally, however, the benchmarking exercise did not find similar qualifications in Chinese Studies offered at NCQF 7 Level. There are, however, qualifications that are offered regionally at NCQF Level 7 that have a more limited focus on the acquisition of proficiency in Mandarin Chinese and basic intercultural skills. The proposed qualification has been benchmarked against Bachelor of Arts Chinese (Studies).

- 1. The University of Zambia offers a 549-credit Bachelor of Arts in Chinese and Linguistics. The programme aims to enable students to develop Chinese language skills, both oral and written. The programme also gives students basic knowledge of Chinese culture, history and literature and gives them an opportunity to learn how to effectively communicate in a variety of domains. Compared to the proposed qualification in which Mandarin Chinese language courses are arranged according to proficiency levels and skills, the qualification at University of Zambia is more linguistics-oriented and more theoretical. For example, modules on Mandarin Chinese are organised according to linguistic concepts such as phonetics and phonology, morphology, syntax, stylistics etc. Nonetheless, the University of Zambia's qualification also covers practical skills such as translation and the use of Chinese in specific practical contexts such a business. In the final year there is the possibility of taking a research module. Learners also have the possibility of embarking on a year-long immersion programme in China.
- 2.The **University of Cape Town (UCT)** (South Africa) offers a 144-credit qualification in **Chinese Studies** as a major under its three-year Bachelor of Arts degree programme. The qualification focuses primarily on the acquisition of Mandarin Chinese language skills. However, aspects of Chinese culture, history and society are occasionally covered as topics of discussion in the process of learning and practising the language. To obtain the qualification learners are expected to reach the equivalent standard benchmarked by HSK (Chinese Proficiency Test) Level 5, which is higher than the proposed qualification. However, unlike the proposed qualification, the UCT qualification does not include modules to actually prepare learners for taking HSK. Neither does the UCT qualification contain modules on the use of Chinese in specific contexts such a tourism or business or modules focusing on professional language skills such as translation and interpreting.
- 3.School of Oriental and African Studies (University of London) (UK) offers a three-year BA Chinese Studies. The qualification aims to provide multi-disciplinary training in Chinese Studies as learners take courses on modern and classical Chinese language and on China-related subjects in various disciplines. Learning outcomes include knowledge on China and of Chinese language, subject-based practical skills, intellectual and critical thinking) skills, and transferable skills. Assessment activities include written examinations, oral examinations, assessed coursework, assessed library assignments, essays and a dissertation, which is optional. The qualification does not include a year abroad. Graduates can work in a variety of sectors and positions. There is also the possibility to pursue postgraduate studies in the field.

4. The **University of Sheffield (UK)** offers a four-year **BA Chinese Studies**. The learning programme includes an immersion programme of one (1) year in China. The first three (3) years focus on the development of language skills and the acquisition of general and more specific knowledge and insights on China. In fourth year learners acquire research skills through research-oriented modules and write a dissertation.

The proposed qualification is offered through a 488-credit programme. It offers a wider range of subjects on China besides language, culture and history, and allows learners to pursue their personal interests within the subject matter. As a multidisciplinary qualification in Chinese Studies at NCQF 7 Level, the proposed qualification is unique in Botswana and the region. The proposed qualification has a strong focus on enabling learners to use Mandarin Chinese flexibly and effectively for social, academic and professional purposes, which is comparable to the qualifications examined. However, unlike for instance at the University of Zambia and the University of Sheffield, the proposed qualification does not entail the possibility of embarking on an immersion programme in China. Generally, the proposed qualification is strongly skills-oriented compared to the qualifications examined with many skills-based courses and assessment activities such as internship, research project and dissertation. The skills imparted include subject-specific skills but also intellectual and transferable skills, including research skills. Because of the inherently multidisciplinary nature of the qualification, it may lead to a wide range of education and employment pathways, as is the case with the examined qualifications.

REVIEW PERIOD

This Qualification shall normally be reviewed after every 5 years. A special review may be carried out if special circumstances occur, such as change of policies or new type of courses to meet new demands.
