### RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

#### RATIONALE:

A Doctor of Philosophy in Education Qualification in Family and Consumer Sciences is relevant as Family and Consumer Sciences give emphasis to issues in communities and the marketplace that affect individual consumers and households. The qualification underscores an interdisciplinary perspective on the various factors involved in improving the quality of life for individuals, family and society. This qualification is in line with Botswana's vision 2036 whose theme is prosperity for all, and in particular Pillar 2 which calls for strong family institutions, health and wellness and social inclusion. The pillar further emphasizes quality education and skills development, which

is in line with Botswana Education & Training Sector Strategic Plan (ETSSP 2015-2020) strategic goals of "Strengthening Skills Development" and "Life-long Learning". The qualification is also relevant to NDP 11, on manpower development. At regional and international levels, the qualification is relevant to SADC Protocol on Education and Training, the UNESCO Education 2030, and the Incheon Declaration and Framework for Action. All these are focused on promoting the implementation of Sustainable Development Goals on skills and competences for relevant quality education. Furthermore, the qualification espouses the ideals of Africa Agenda 2063 (Aspiration 1: A prosperous Africa based on inclusive growth and sustainable development), which is The Africa We Want, on enhancing socio-economic transformation for sustainable development and growth.

### **QUALIFICATION AWARD AND CERTIFICATION**

### **Qualification Award**

To be awarded the Doctor of Philosophy in Education (Family and Consumer Sciences) qualification, a candidate is required to achieve a minimum of 360 credits.

#### **Certification Award**

Candidates meeting prescribed requirements will be awarded Doctor of Philosophy in Education (Family and Consumer Sciences) and will be issued a certificate and an official transcript.

### REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

#### **Similarities**

 This qualification has a similar NQF level of 10 to the University of South Africa, University of Pretoria but differs from the qualification of Texas Tech University which still uses the credit system.

- This qualification's domains/modules are similar to that of the Universities of South Africa and Pretoria which comprise a thesis worth 360 credits.
- This qualification is research-based (without coursework) and comparable to those of the universities of Pretoria and South Africa
- Similarly, this qualification is assessed through a thesis/dissertation which is equivalent to the
  qualifications from the University of South Africa, the University of Pretoria, and Texas Tech
  University.
- The qualification rules and minimum Standards for the award of the qualification is like that of the University of South Africa and Texas Tech University which require completion of thesis/dissertation and oral defense of the dissertation.
- The award of qualification is equivalent to that of the University of Pretoria which requires a published article in addition to the completion of the thesis and oral defense of the dissertation.
- The education and employment pathways for this qualification focus on research and academia similar to that of Texas Tech University.

### Differences

- The title of this qualification differs from that of the Universities of South Africa and Pretoria. It focuses
  on education in Family and Consumer Sciences whereas the others are Doctor of Consumer Sciences
  focusing on specific disciplines in Family and Consumer Sciences like Consumer Sciences and
  Clothing Management.
- The qualification differs from that of Texas Tech University which has 72 credits. This is because of the different systems used by the institutions.
- The duration for this qualification is four (4) years while others take three (3) years.
- This qualification is different from that of Texas Tech University which includes both course work and research.
- The award of qualification differs from that of the University of South Africa which does not require a
  published article in addition to the completion of the dissertation.
- The education and employment pathways for this qualification which focus on research and academia differ from that of the University of South Africa and Pretoria which focus on research only.

#### **REVIEW PERIOD**

The qualification will be reviewed every 5 years.
