RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

RATIONALE:

The Master of Arts in Theology and Religious Studies (MA) is designed to give students the tools for practical application of theological knowledge. In pursuance of a purposeful and industry-relevant and high quality qualification, the MA in Theology and Religious Studies is anchored on Botswana's Vision 2036. Through the vison Botswana endeavors to have a moral, tolerant and inclusive society which is built on such factors as the spiritual well-being of its people, strong family institution's, social inclusion and equality (including gender equality), education and skills development (Botswana Vision 2036). The qualification is also informed by NDP 9's Revised National Policy on Education (RNPE) which underscores the infusion and integration of emerging issues into the education system including HIV and AIDS issues, environmental, population/family education and gender education. In consultation with the department of Theology and Religious Studies Advisory Board and their representative stakeholders, the MA in Theology and Religious Studies qualification seeks to advance practical theological skills aimed at changing mindsets in relation to such issues as environmental conservation, gender justice, sexualities and sexual orientations all of which are pertinent global issues. The issues are to be addressed from different religious and philosophical perspectives which allows for critical thinking aimed at

creating unity in diversity. As such the MA in Theology and Religious Studies offers leaners the choice between four specialization areas of Biblical Studies, Systematic Theology, Religious Studies and Philosophy.

The qualification acknowledges that religion is an integral part of human life and culture. As such theological education that aims for the humanization and liberation of the human mind is significantly needed to achieve such competencies and values as tolerance, justice, compassion as espoused in the *National Human Resource Development Strategy* (2009-2022) and the *Botswana Education and Training Sector Strategy Plan* (2015-2020) which emphasize the preparation of students for life, citizenship and the world of work by providing training that is responsive and relevant to the needs of the economy. Therefore there is need for high quality research and ethical training to address such social ills as gender-based violence, global warming etc. by graduates of this qualification who will approach the issues from diversified religious, cultural and philosophical perspectives.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this qualification is to produce graduates with advanced knowledge, skills and competencies to:

- Provide both the Clergy and the laity with life skills and spiritual resources from Christian traditions and diverse and multi-faith contexts.
- Articulate the themes and distinctiveness of the field of Theology and Religious Studies from the disciplines of counselling, sociology, and psychology Teaching (religious education)
- Engage in research projects for the field of Theology and Religious Studies aimed at improving the lives
 of their communities.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (including access and inclusion)

Entry requirements for Master of Arts Theology and Religious Studies qualification are as follows:

- NCQF Level 7 or equivalent qualification.
- Entry through Recognition of Prior Learning in line with Institutional and National Policies on recognition of prior learning.

The proposed MA in Theology and Religious Studies is similar to both regional and international Universities, in terms of title of Qualification, employment Pathways and assessment strategies and content.

Differences

At the University of Wales the duration for the MA in Theological Studies is One (1) year while for the proposed qualification and the region the duration is Two (2) years. This is because in some international universities the MA is by research only and there is no course work required.
