RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

RATIONALE:

The sub-field of **Beauty Therapy and Related Work** has been identified as one of the occupations in high demand according to the Human Resource Development Council's Priority Occupation List of 2019 (**Coded No. 5142 Beauty and Related Work**). This is based on the Labour Market Analysis conducted by the HRDC.

Furthermore, HRDC's Priority Skills and Employment Trends Forecasts for Botswana's Top Occupations in demand (page 3), highlighted that Beauty Therapy occupation is currently experiencing shortages in the labour market and is an occupation with relatively high employment growth over a long term period. The report forecasts a future demand of 1,917 Hairdressers, Barbers, Beauty Therapist and related Workers from 2019 –



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2028 (pg. 3).

This qualification has been designed to develop a broad range of skills appropriate to a person who is undergoing training or works in the beauty industry. The core to the development of this qualification is to bring out the culture of professionalism and service excellence in the Beauty Therapy industry. The qualification brings together the theoretical and practical elements of beauty therapy and will help to professionalize the beauty industry.

The crucial specialization areas identified for this qualification are Spa Treatments and Masseuse with the following technical skills and soft skills:

Technical Skills

- Spa Treatments
- Anatomy and physiology
- Cosmetic Science

Soft Skills

- Customer care
- Communication
- Hygiene and Safety

PURPOSE: (itemise exit level outcomes)

The purpose of the qualification is to equip graduates with advanced knowledge, skills and competencies to:

- Demonstrate knowledge of Cosmetic Science, Anatomy and Physiology, Health and Lifestyles in the Beauty Therapy Environments
- Provide Specialised Body Therapy, Facials (Make Up, Prosthetics), Nail, Hands and Feet Treatment Services to Clients
- Carry out depilation, camouflage, permanent and non permanent hair treatments in a healthy and safe beauty spa
- Demonstrate Professionalism and Entrepreneurial Skills in the Beauty Therapy Industry

MINIMUM ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (including access and inclusion)

Minimum entry requirement for this qualification is NCQF Level IV BGCSE or equivalent with a pass in English and Science

Credit Accumulation and Transfer (CAT) and Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL):

CAT and RPL Provisions shall be applied to allow candidates to start this qualification at a level that is consistent with the knowledge and skills gained from prior learning. This would be applied in relation to CAT and RPL

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ASSESSMENT ARRANGEMENTS

FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT

Formative assessment or continuous assessment contributing towards the award of credits should be based on module (unit) outcomes and the contribution of formative assessment to the final grade shall be 60%.

SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT

Candidates shall undergo assessment. The final assessment for each module (unit) contributes 40% of the final mark for that module.

MODERATION ARRANGEMENTS

BQA accredited subject specialists in relevant fields and with relevant industry experience shall be engaged to conduct internal and external moderation in accordance with applicable policies and regulations.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) assessment for the award of the qualification shall be in accordance with applicable RPL policies and relevant national-level policy and legislative framework. Implementation of RPL shall also be consistent with requirements, if any, prescribed for the field or sub-field of study by relevant national, regional or international professional bodies.

CREDIT ACCUMULATION AND TRANSFER

Candidates may submit evidence of credits accumulated in related qualification in order to be credited for the qualification they are applying for.

QUALIFICATION AWARD AND CERTIFICATION

For a Candidate to be awarded Diploma in Beauty Therapy must acquire **a minimum requirement of 370 credits**.

Certification

A certificate will be awarded to a Candidate upon completion of the qualification in accordance with applicable policies.

SUMMARY OF REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

This qualification has been benchmarked against similar Regional and International Qualifications.

The qualification compares well with those offered by the following institutions:

- Diploma in Beauty Therapy Victoria University Melborne– Australia
- Beauty Therapy ITEC Diploma College of Capetown South Africa
- Diploma in Beauty Therapy Cape town Invana Training College South Africa

Internationally:

Victoria University Melbourne Australia offers Diploma in Beauty Therapy of which one must complete 25



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units of competency comprising of 13 core and 12 electives comparing very well with the proposed Diploma in Beauty Therapy qualification in which one has to complete 23 units of competency comprising of 8 Fundamentals 13 core and choose a minimum of 2 out of 7 electives. Both qualifications have provisions for work-based or industrial attachments as well as institutionalised practical assessments. The unit titles are similar such as manicure, pedicure, spa treatments, and massage, facial treatments and progression pathways. Similarly the units covered at Diploma level in Botswana are the same as those covered at Victoria University in Australia. The allocated credits for this qualification have not been spelt out.

Regionally:

The Cape town Invana Training College in South Africa Offers Diploma in Beauty Therapy at 240 credits and College of Cape town in SA offers Beauty Therapy ITEC diploma. Both institutions got some similar units/modules such as Health and safety, consultation techniques, manicure and pedicure treatment, Skin type analysis. Skin Anatomy and physiology for beauty therapist as the core. The modules contents are similar to this qualification and they are all at the Diploma levels; however the only difference is the naming of some modules but with similar content with the ones proposed for this qualification.

In addition to the technical expertise infused on the graduates, this qualification inculcates the most soughtafter generic skills like communications, research, Information Technology and ethical attributes to produce a market ready graduate. The incorporation of industrial attachment as a distinct module emphasises the significance of industrial exposure in ensuring a globally competitive graduate of this qualification.

REVIEW PERIOD

The qualification will be reviewed every five **(5) years** or as and when required depending on the changing needs of the market

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
