RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

RATIONALE:

The Human Resource Development Council Priority Skills (2019) identified beauticians, anatomy, customer relations and spa treatments as some of the key skills in demand. This qualification responds to the need identified by the HRDC. The qualification will provide learners with knowledge and skills to carry out advanced beauty therapy treatments, enabling learners to gain the necessary skills and essential underpinning knowledge to work commercially as Beauty Therapists.



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The qualification will also provide opportunities for learners to develop the necessary occupational skills and competencies to progress directly into employment or further their studies. The learning outcomes of the qualification are aligned to the QUALIFI Beauty Therapy International Standard to meet the industry standards and ensure international comparability and competitiveness of the graduates.

PURPOSE: (itemise exit level outcomes)

The purpose of this qualification is to produce graduates with advanced skills knowledge, and competencies to:

- Provide skin and body treatments effectively and suited to client's needs.
- Plan and provide spa management and advanced beauty services.
- Implement operational requirements for running beauty spas.
- Apply knowledge and understanding of cosmetic science, products composition, sources and their potential effects on various skin types.

QUALIFICATION AWARD AND CERTIFICATION

Minimum Standard of achievement for the award of the qualification.

- Graduates will be awarded the Diploma in Beauty Therapy upon attainment of 360 credits.
- There will be issuance of certificate and an official transcript.

SUMMARY OF REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY



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- **Titles**: This qualification bears the same title (Diploma in Beauty Therapy) as those compared with both regionally (South Africa) and internationally (UK).
- Exit level outcomes: The exit level outcomes also similar in terms of knowledge, skills and
 competences as all cover spa management, product knowledge, body and skin treatments and
 operational requirements. The exit level outcomes for this qualification have been aligned to those of
 the benchmarks to ensure parity.
- The Credits: The benchmark qualifications bear 240 credits which equates to 2 years duration. In
 contrast, this qualification is worth 360 credits which equates to 3 years duration. The difference in
 credit value and duration is brought about by the project, industrial attachment and additional core
 components of this qualification. The components have been introduced to enhance competence and
 provide learners with field exposure to enable integrated assessment, hence the 360 credits or 3 year
 duration.
- **NQF Levels**: This qualification has the same NQF level (6) as the regional (South African) benchmark, has been compared to a UK equivalent RQF Level 5).
- Main modules: This qualification has all the modules found in the benchmarks. In addition, some of
 the modules such as Intimate waxing, Glamour and corrective make up, Body Electrical Therapy,
 Advanced Swedish Body Massage, Skin Needling, Threading, Indian Head Massage and Application
 of Henna were added as core modules to keep up with the emerging trends in the industry. In
 addition, the modules will provide learners with wider competence domains and richer learning
 experiences.

In conclusion, this qualification is similar with the regional and international benchmarks in terms title, credits, NQF level and exit outcomes. In terms of content and depth, this qualification is better than the benchmarks.

REVIEW PERIOD

This qualification will be reviewed after 5 years.
