### RATIONALE AND PURPOSE OF THE QUALIFICATION

### RATIONALE:

Botswana is experiencing a high burden of health problems and currently, emerging epidemics such as non-communicable diseases, substance abuse problems and pandemics. These conditions create numerous health problems in our communities and the nation at large and place a considerable burden on the economy. Therefore, there is a need to address the situation through research interventions and enable evidence based care. Only scholars and clinicians in nursing prepared at the doctoral level are capabable of producing scientific knowledge which can solve the country 's health problems. There are limited numbers of scientisst prepared at this level in the country (15 at the most) out of which 5 of thesm have retired and about half wil also soon retire as well. Thus the country needs garaduates prepared at this level if nursing too is to participate in the development of knowledge economy. Finding admission for these candidate in other countries is very competitive and limited in terms of cost and securing of admission. Thus development of a home grown programme will not only improve accessibility but will also cut on the exorbitant costs incurred. The National Development Plan 11 (2017 – 2023) calls for improvement of quality health care services through strengthened human capital. Human Resource Development Council (HRDC) Strategy (2016), indicates that advancing the education and numbers of



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professional nurses is one of the most important human resource priorities in Botswana. The World Health Organization Global Strategic Directions for Strengthening Nursing and Midwifery (2016 – 2020) has set goals focused on ensuring an educated, competent and motivated nursing and midwifery workforce capable of advancing the development of knowledge in the discipline of nursing.

### **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this qualification is to produce graduates with the most advanced knowledge, skills and competences to:

- Conduct original scholarly research that will inform generation of solutions to complex and unprediactable nursing problems.
- Assumme leadership in the condcutct of cultutrally and linguistically appropriate scholarhip.
- Lead in advancing the discipline through schorlarly contributions and the development of nursing science in the global community.
- Generate and disseminate knowledge relevant to health care policy.
- Communicate research through publications and presentations to professionals, interdisciplinary and other stakeholders.

### **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (including access and inclusion)**

- A Master's Degree in the same or a cognate field of study. NCQF Level 9
- Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and Credit Accumulation and Transfer (CAT) will be considered for access and inclusion using the relevant institutional policies inline with national RPL and CAT policies.

### QUALIFICATION AWARD AND CERTIFICATION



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Candidates meeting prescribed requirements will be awarded the qualification in accordance with standards prescribed for the award of the qualification and applicable policies.

Candidates are required to achieve a minimum of **386** credits and to have published at least one journal article in a peer reviewed journal to be awarded Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing.

### REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

The Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing qualification was benchmarked with several qualifications in the region such as the Universities of Stellenbosch, Fort Hare, Zululand, Western Cape and Cape Town and internationally with the Victoria University of Wellington Australia, University of California San Francisco and the University of Pennsylvania. From that exercise a lot of similarities and differences were noted whereby at Fort Hare University and University of Cape Town the qualification is a Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing. All other universities have Doctor of Nursing degree. Although the names of the qualification differs slightly, the NQF level (Level 10) and credit value is more or less the same (360 credits) as this qualification.

Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing is a 4 year fulltime and 6 years parttime qualification. The qualification structure composes of fundamental and core worth 386 credits. This qualification exceeds the cerdits (360) stipulated in those qualifications that it is being compared with because of the two modules in research and philosophy to be offered to prepare our graduates to develop skills in knowlwdge development making total credits 386 instead of 360.

The exit outcomes at the University of Stellenbosch are comparable to those in the proposed Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing qualifiaction in terms of focusing on the research and development of science and knowledge. All of the programmes in the universities mentioned are thesis-based. The University of Stellenbosch added a component of care and service whereas the proposed qualifiaction focuses more on research and knowledge development. The Universities of Fort Hare, Zululand and Western Cape focus more on clinical and consultant roles, although the research component comes out strongly in the assessment criteria, culminating in the development and successful thesis/dissertation defense. Victoria University of Wellington offers includes course work and thesis and some



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clinical focus area.
